Perhaps most visibly, our Beautification Committee worked with Roebuck Wholesale Nursery and Landscaping to enhance the four entrances we maintain. The additional pops of color create a more welcoming entry and display our neighborhood's beauty to anyone passing by.

Frequently Asked Questions

• Who can I contact if the sidewalk in front of my house needs repair? The City's Streets & Stormwater Maintenance Department (596-2089). More information at http://www.cityofspartanburg.org/public-services/streets-stormwater/streets-maintenance.

• What can I do if a house on my street is a nuisance? *http://www.cityofspartanburg.org /community-services/property-maintenance/faq.* Code violations may be reported at http://www.cityofspartanburg.org/community-services/property-maintenance/report.

• When should I put my garbage bin out? Thursday. Garbage should not be put out more than 24 hours in advance of pick up day when possible.

• Rules about green waste: http://www.cityofspartanburg.org/public-services/solid-waste/greenwaste (CH is Area 8). Separated into separate piles of brush, grass clippings, and leaves and placed at least 3 feet from obstacles like mail boxes, poles, cars, etc. Limbs should be shorter than 6 feet and thinner than 6 inches in diameter.

• What is the recycling schedule? Second and fourth Mondays of each month. There is an online form to request an additional bin (for \$50) on the City's website at http://www.cityofspartan burg.org/recycling

• What can be recycled? Aluminum, empty metal cans, plastics (nos. 1-7), paper and boxboard, flattened corrugated cardboard, and coated cartons (milk, orange juice, etc.). Glass is no longer accepted for recycling. Items should go loose into the bin, not enclosed in plastic bags.

Neighbors Support Crystal Springs Restoration

It's been almost four years since the Converse Heights Neighborhood Association took on the task of returning the Crystal Springs Ravine—bordered by Sherwood Circle, Woodburn Road and Crystal Drive—to a natural Piedmont Forest, and we've made remarkable progress. Gone are many of the urban castoffs of old tires and beer bottles. Gone are many of the invasive plants from privet to English ivy. How do you like the recently enhanced landscaping at the main entrances to Converse Heights?

Earlier this spring, the Converse Heights Neighborhood Association (CHNA) approved an increase in the neighborhood's beautification budget. What you're seeing now is the result—a rich variety of beautiful flowers and new landscaping at the intersections of East Main Street and Mills, Twin Drive at Pine Street and Connecticut at Woodburn Road.

Beautification Committee members met several times with Roebuck Wholesale Nursery & Landscaping project manager Shane Knight to develop plans for the entrances that would provide greater visual impact and still be something the neighborhood could afford.

There were some problems with the plantings in early May. Shortly after the upgrades, someone was stealing plants on Twin Drive and on Connecticut. The beds were replanted, and Spartanburg City Police agreed to keep an eye on the landscaping during their night patrols through Converse Heights.

"CHNA's goal is to keep Converse Heights "Safe, Beautiful, and Fun," said Association Chair Alyson Campbell. "We think our investment in this new beautification effort is good for both neighborhood aesthetics and home values. Thanks to the generous support of our dues-paying members for making this possible."
